Shana's stifle injury has continued to heal and we have been using her in the program. Archi suffered an allergic reaction to something that either bit or stung him or perhaps he

swallowed. He has made a full recovery. • The hay shed project is slowly moving forward and there are plans to install another run-in shed in the south pasture in preparation for this winter.

Financial support: We have purchased about 1/2 the hay we need for the year. Since our hay shed construction has not yet begun, our supplier has graciously allowed us to keep the rest of the hay in his storage for us until we are ready to pick it up next March. One ton of hay is \$225. We will be building another run-in shed for the horses for the upcoming winter which costs about \$1000.
