Financial update: ♦ Training for Gracie will be \$400 per month for 3 months. ♦ We will be purchasing the final 1/3 of our hay for this year sometime in the next few weeks. The hay shed construction continues, and we are putting beams up for the roofing now. We have 7 more tons of hay being held for us. One ton of hay is \$225. ♦ The vet and farrier were out last month to vaccinate and trim hooves. One set of vaccinations was \$80. A hoof trim for one horse was \$30.
